

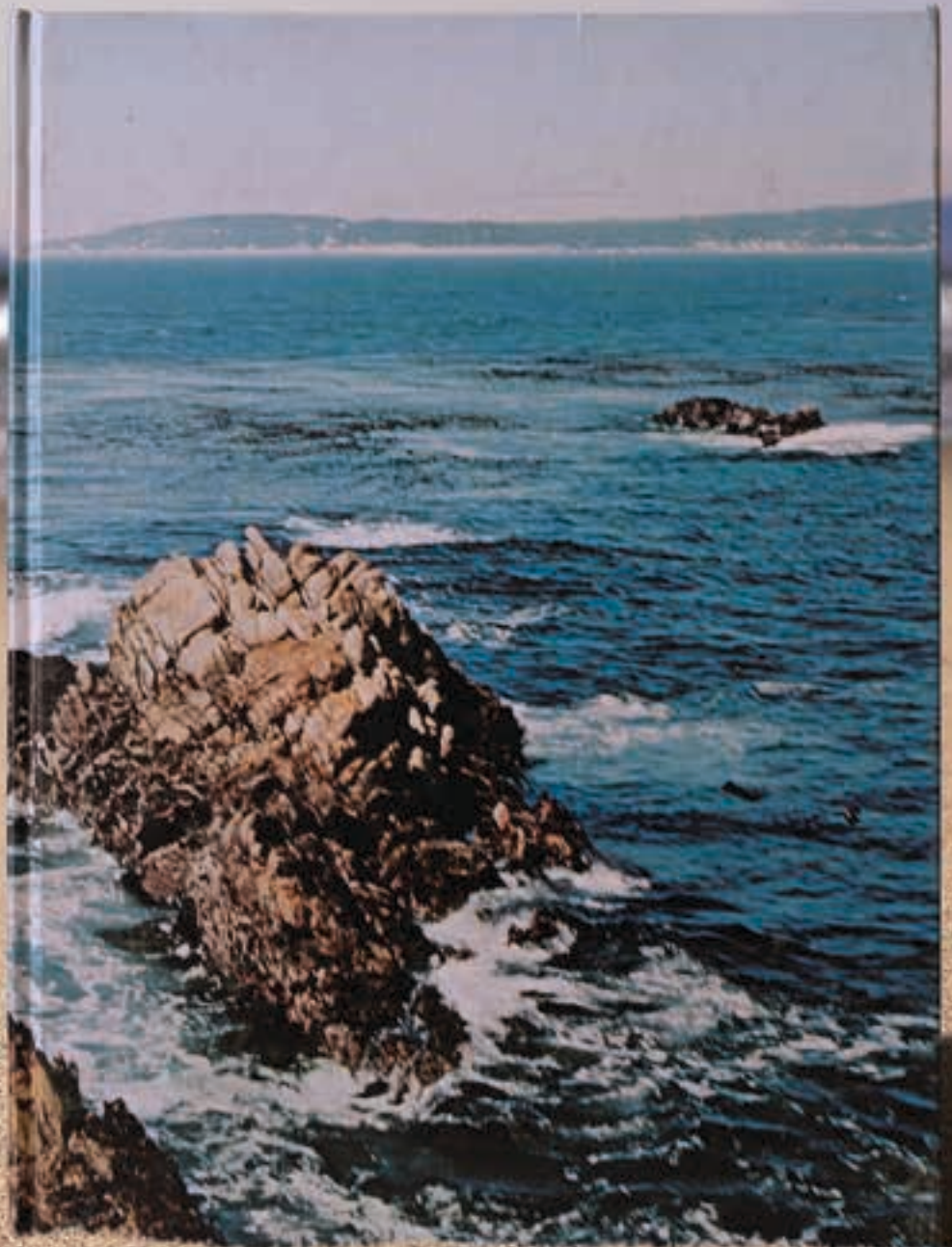

EDITOR'S MESSAGE



Lean On Me

In 1967, singer-songwriter and musician, Bill Withers, had recently moved to Los Angeles, CA, in hopes of starting a music career. Life was not easy as he fought to make a living in the big city. Having spent most of his life living in the coal mining town of Slab Fork, WV, Bill found his journey in Los Angeles to be quite lonely. He missed the sense of community, fellowship, and friendship that was ever present in his West Virginia hometown.

As a struggling musician, Withers couldn't afford much, but was able to purchase a small piano that he would sit at and compose tunes. Yet, his music went completely unnoticed until 1972. While sitting at the piano, running his fingers up and down the keyboard, the phrase "lean on me" crossed his mind. It didn't take him long to complete the words and music for a song that would go on to become an inspirational, worldwide rallying song encouraging togetherness for those going through difficult times.

I share this short story and a few lines of this song with you because now, more than ever before, we must lean on each other for encouragement, help, and support. Sometimes leaning on others for help is looked upon as a sign of weakness. We either believe our problems are bigger than anyone else's and we choose not to burden others, or we believe we can just go it alone. I disagree with both of these views. Leaning on each other actually brings strength to both of us. Ecclesiastes 4:9–10 says: *Two are*

better than one, because they have a better return on their labor. If either of them falls down, one can help the other up.

During this past year, MBA has leaned heavily on you, our friends and alumni, and you have rallied around *our home on the shore*. Last April and May, as a majority of the families of our 2020 graduates experienced financial hardship due to COVID-19, we called on you to help us to graduate the senior class debt free. In six incredible weeks, over \$90,000 was raised and every senior graduated debt free! During the summer, we called on you to help us *Bring Them Back* in the fall. Again, the MBA spirit rallied and we raised \$160,000 in Student Aid funds to help with the fall enrollment. And, they came back! In November, we leaned on you once again, calling for help with the budget deficit due to the unexpected Beach Auditorium fire and clean-up expenses. You rallied once again raising over \$320,000. Thank you, our MBA brothers and sisters, for understanding these issues and lending a hand. Together, we did it!

This issue of *Sandscripts* is in honor of you—**our donors**—who have given so generously during a very difficult time for MBA, our communities, and our country. There simply are no words that adequately convey our gratitude for what you have done. Thank you for your rallying spirit. Thank you for your support and for allowing us to lean on you and to help us carry on.



Yet, how does an entire organization define a relationship with their people? After much thought into our history and our future, Monterey Bay Academy defines it with the following outstanding examples of just some of the people who have contributed their strengths and abilities to help create a stronger MBA.

Honoring the Past

The People and Memories that Shaped the Future

As the *founding father* of Monterey Bay Academy, **Elder Leal V. Grunke** had a vision that this former World War II military base, Camp McQuaide, could become a Seventh-day Adventist academy like no other. Its geographical location and opportunities for industry seemed ideal. At the time, not many shared his vision for Camp McQuaide. Elder Grunke’s *perseverance* paid off when the United States government agreed to give the base to the Central California Conference at no cost.

After 41 years of continuous employment at MBA, plus 12 additional years as a staff volunteer, **Steve Walls** has been a *continuous positive influence* on the MBA campus for 52 of its 72 years of existence. He is the longest serving MBA staff member in school history, and perhaps of any Adventist academy. He has worked under eight of the school’s ten principals. He has served as a mentor to his fellow staff members and has touched thousands of lives over his career as a master teacher.

As a retired attorney and California trial court judge, **Tom Seibly '55** has worked with some of our past government classes, preparing for the county mock trial competition. He has also been *instrumental in bringing major financial support* to his alma mater of his own, and through friendships and connections with others. Looking to the Future

Sharing the Vision, What We Can Achieve Through Endowments

Ramona (Richli) Clark '57 is MBA's version of Ruth Bader Ginsburg—only in a medical profession way. Arriving at MBA at 14 years old, with her missionary parents living overseas, Ramona's teen years were guided by the faculty and staff at MBA. One of only two women among 75 men in medical school in the early 1960s, she paved the path for women in this career field. A board-certified radiologist, she had to go above and beyond (especially after she became a mother) to prove she could do the job, and the hours. From college, medical school, internship, and practice, she was met with constant resistance that a woman could be a doctor. Not only a respected trailblazer in the medical field, Ramona has devoted decades of her life to MBA. She has served non-stop as an alumni board member and school board trustee. However, the greatest gift to MBA has been her action towards the future of MBA. She established an endowment that is for the sole

purpose of providing continuing education courses for the MBA faculty. "To have an excellent school, one must have dedicated, excellent teachers," says Dr. Clark. "The fund helps to keep teachers abreast of new developments in their field." Several thousand dollars per year provides this opportunity to our faculty and thankfully *will do so for the life of MBA.*

SERVICE TO GOD — From 1968–2012, there was a Pastor Speyer (sometimes two) on the MBA campus. That's 44 years! **Pastor Fred Speyer** pastored the MBA church for 20 years as well as teaching Bible classes. **Pastor Jon Speyer '75** returned to the campus in 1987 to teach Bible classes. Although each had their own style of teaching, each shared a common passion: *to educate teenagers on the unconditional love of Jesus Christ.* The *10-SPEYER-ED* legacy will live on in the hearts and minds of those who were influenced by these two men of God. Their father/son prayer would be, *...that the Son of God may be glorified through it.* JOHN 11:4 (NKJV). **Randy Speyer '79**, middle son of Fred, is now the Director of Mission and Spiritual Care at Adventist Health in Roseville, CA. He is leading the organization in providing spiritual care for both employees and patients. Randy has also been "Pastor Speyer" his entire career—most recently at the Loma Linda University Church, prior to this new position at Adventist Health. These men have demonstrated service to others throughout their lifetime.

SERVICE TO COUNTRY — **Chaplain (Major) Saul Castillo '82**, has served in the U.S. Army since 1994, after completing his masters of divinity degree at Andrews University. His ministry of *spiritually comforting soldiers and their families* has brought hundreds before him in varying circumstances.

Terry Schmunk '66, was the only missionary dentist serving in Vietnam in the mid-70s during the war. In the 1980s, he joined the Army Reserves. Colonel Schmunk went to many foreign countries and was deployed to Iraq in 2007, commanding the 307th Medical Company. *Healing his fellow soldiers* was his call to service.

Hillary Rollins '09, was accepted into the U.S. Military Academy at West Point in 2010. As senior class president in 2009 at MBA, it was clear she was *destined to leadership.*



SERVICE TO ALL HUMANITY — **Dr. Frank Baughman '52**, has been an active member of the Rotary Club in the Porterville, CA, area for 54 years. His club specifically helped fund and build a Christian school in Africa. Half of the students are Seventh-day Adventist. Frank and his wife, **Shirlee '52**, have advocated and supported several folks in that village over the years *to obtain their education to better assist their fellow villagers.*

Dr. Scott Nelson '88, an orthopaedic surgeon, felt the mission to serve others in third-world countries. Working for Cure International, Scott served the people of the Dominican Republic and Haiti. Eventually, he and his family returned to the United States—Loma Linda University area—and Scott works at the university hospital. He continues his dedication by taking a team of medical volunteers with him several times per year (prior to COVID-19) to Haiti and other countries who have been ravaged by earthquake and poverty. Scott *focuses on what and who God places before him.* He believes and claims Psalm 46 (NIV), *God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble.* He wants to be present with God in helping those he can with the God-given talents and skills that have been given to him.



Charlotte Henderson served as the Director of Alumni and Development for MBA from 2008–2014. The alumni mentioned in this article were honored by Charlotte during her tenure at MBA. She currently serves as a consultant and manager of the mentorship program for Philanthropic Service for Institutions (PSI) of the Seventh-day Adventist North American Division. In 2020, she authored the Adventist Academy Alumni Guide handbook for PSI. In addition, she owns a private fundraising consulting business, in which schools may take advantage of her four decades of expertise in educational fundraising. *Thank you, Charlotte, for your dedication to MBA and Adventist education.*



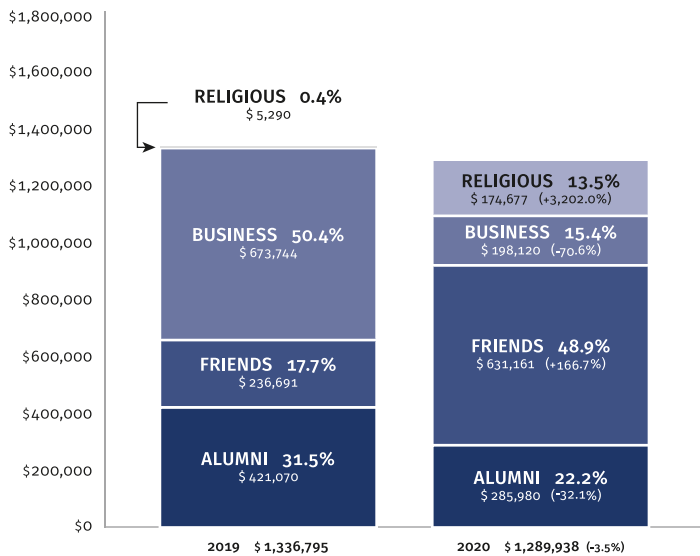

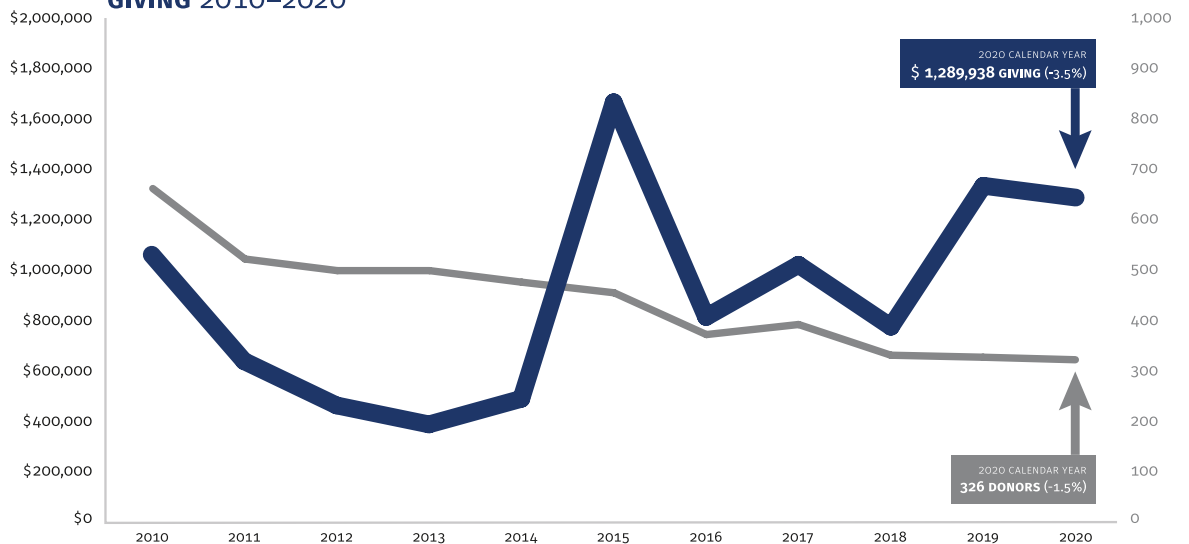
